

Judge Tyler's Picture Received

Presented to County Clerk Ray F. Henderson

A Parkersburg salesman recently presented County Clerk Ray F. Henderson of Tyler county with a framed picture of Judge Tyler, for whom Tyler county was named.

An oil painting of Judge Tyler hangs in the Hall of Governors in the Capitol building of Virginia at Richmond. The picture presented to Tyler county was made from this oil painting.

Judge Tyler was the eighth governor of Virginia and the father of President John Tyler. He was born in York county, Virginia, in 1747 and served in the colonial armies during the Revolutionary War. He was Governor of Virginia, 1808-1811, and died in 1813.

Tyler county was formed from the boundaries of Ohio and Wood counties in 1814 and began to function as a governing unit in 1815. Later, Wetzel county and a part of Pleasants county were carved from its boundaries.

J. Lee Hornor Passes Away

Harrison County Assessor Succumbs to Long Illness

James Lee Hornor, 53, assessor of Harrison county for the past eight years and a veteran business leader there, succumbed to an illness of complications at 4:30 Wednesday afternoon, May 15, in a Clarksburg hospital.

His death ended an active career in the political, civic and business life in Harrison county.

Mr. Hornor was a civil engineer, coal operator and dealer. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Grace B. Hornor, and three sons, Frank B., Donald C. and Lawrence C.

Mr. Hornor had been an influential Democrat and in 1932 was elected assessor by a huge majority and again in 1936 had little difficulty in being re-elected. He served as president of the West Virginia Assessors' association during the year of 1939. Because of failing health he chose not to be a candidate to succeed himself as assessor of Harrison county this year.

Mr. Hornor was considered one of the outstanding assessors in West Virginia.



J. E. Batten, Sr., father of J. E. Batten, Jr., assistant superintendent of the McDowell county schools, died recently at his home near Clarksburg.



They Run Lincoln County's Schools

In this picture you see the Lincoln county board of education in its new quarters. The building was formerly the Farmers and Merchants Bank building and consists of a suite of offices upstairs, five in number, and a large assembly room and an office for the superintendent and the assistant superintendent downstairs, together with a large vault for safekeeping of records.

The construction of the building is stucco over brick, and its ample accommodations and modern furniture and conveniences make it probably the best quarters in the state for a board of education. Upstairs there are offices for the board of education, the county attendance director and a waiting room, the financial clerk, the bookkeeper and transportation supervisor.
